Vocational Service - this year we decided to suspend Vocational Service Awards and look to adopt a different approach next year. We contributed to the Impact100 awards and awarded a PHF to ex-Mayor Peter Abelson.

International Service - another successful hand team visit to Vietnam and an agreement with Lane Cove club to support the extension of their project in Myanmar. PDG Danny was awarded an extremely prestigious award by the President of Vietnam. We are waiting to get feedback from Queenwood in respect to the Show That Grows project. Our club now has a supply of wheelchairs and we expect to start fundraising for this marvellous project when the school year restarts in 2018.

Community Service - we have continued to support the Books in Home project at Hebersham Public School as well as making further contributions to the Manly Warringah Women's Refuge. We have committed the proceeds of our Xmas Raffle to the Rotary Foundation "End Polio Now" project. With other club related contributions we expect to donate at least \$10,000 to the foundation this rotary year.

Youth Service - we have been blessed with two superb exchange students this year and will be wishing Haruto a safe return to Japan and his family next week. We have continued our support for youth related projects such as MUNA and RYLA and reached a milestone this year when 3 students were successful in gaining entry to the National Youth Science Forum only to have one of them decline because he had been admitted to an even more prestigious program. And of course we have continued to be the coordinating club for RYPEN; successful to the point that the program may well be extended to a second course.

None of the above could be achieved without the dedication and contribution of many club members. We should all feel very proud of what we have achieved so far and look forward to even more in the second half of the rotary year.
