The Heartland Academy is based in Nepal and was formed some years ago with the active participation of the Rotary Club of Lane Cove. It is a democratic school practicing quality & non-violent education which provides co-educational education from nursery all the way through to Plus Two.

Lane Cove has recently applied for a Global Grant from the Rotary Foundation. Our club is one of the contributors with \$1500 being committed to the project. The project will focus on further extending the school's curriculum to provide selected senior students with teacher training skills so that they can become qualified teachers immediately after finishing high school. This will be a very significant advance in a country where most teachers have received no teacher training at all. There will again be a heavy emphasis on including female students.



SNOOKER AT THE MOSMAN ROTARY CLUB

In the early years of the Club billiards and snooker were having resurgence in popularity. All clubs and pubs had at least one table and there were extensive snooker parlours and clubs throughout the city. In some towns it was more common to install a snooker table ahead of a swimming pool. Not to be left behind members of the Rotary Club who owned a table would host snooker nights. The 18th May 1973 OOZOO reports "over the last few months a staggering number of members have shown unmistakeable signs of a misspent youth"! Competition was strong and fellowship even stronger. One feature I recall was the ham and mustard sandwiches.

In 1980 Bill Gordon (Property Development) instituted a Snooker championship, played at his home. When Jack Searley (Mercery Retailing) died in June 1985 the Trophy, played for since 1980 was named in his honour. The trophy resurfaced at our meeting last week and Sergeant Blair Leslie (Travel Services) charged the most recent winner Charlie (Army Defence) was tasked with organising a new competition.
